ERO scoping visit to Timor-Leste

Purpose

- 1. This briefing provides you with information regarding a forthcoming ERO scoping visit to Timor-Leste.
- A two-person education evaluation team will meet with Timor-Leste Ministry of Education and Culture officials, in-country New Zealand Aid Programme officials, and their stakeholders, to scope priorities for developing policy and systems to build Timor-Leste education evaluation capability.

Background

- 3. New Zealand has a strong bilateral engagement with Timor-Leste, especially through the provision of development assistance.
- 4. In May 2016, ERO met with officials from the Timor-Leste Ministry of Education and Culture, including the Inspector General, in Wellington. This meeting focused on ERO providing advice regarding what Timor-Leste pre-school (early learning) inspectors could do to support improvement in the provision of early childhood education in Timor-Leste.
- 5. In May 2018, ERO learned, through the HANDS (*Halimar, Aprende, no Deskobre; Susesu*) liaison officer in Timor-Leste, that following the 2016 meeting with ERO, the Ministry "has made some really effective gains" in pre-school inspection, and that the Inspector General is looking to expand the good practice of pre-school evaluation to other education sub-sectors.

- 6. The HANDS programme is a Timor-Leste early childhood education programme with significant aid funding from New Zealand and strong links with the Timor-Leste Ministry of Education and Culture, in-country New Zealand Aid Programme, and New Zealand Embassy officials.
- 7. In June 2018, ERO corresponded with Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT) officials about the request from HANDS to provide advice on quality assurance to improve evaluation in early childhood education, and the possibility of funding to cover ERO costs. MFAT thanked ERO for considering the proposal, noting that "strengthening Early Childhood Education in Timor-Leste remains a pressing need for the population and a key priority for the New Zealand Aid Programme's work [there]"; and that funding via HANDS was available for travel, accommodation, and per diem expenses.
- 8. ERO has now been asked to assist Timor-Leste Ministry of Education and Culture officials, in-country New Zealand Aid Programme officials, and their stakeholders, to scope priorities for developing policy and systems to build education evaluation capability in Timor-Leste.
- 9. Consequently, ERO has agreed to undertake the scoping visit this year hosted and partially funded by HANDS (travel and accommodation costs, per diem allowance).
- 10. This scoping review work is a standalone project. Any additional or future work by ERO will be on a full cost recovery basis.

Evaluation team and travel arrangements

- 11. The evaluation team will involve two senior ERO staff with extensive evaluation experience in New Zealand and in international contexts.
- 12. It will involve a week's work in Dili.

Recommendations
